

Transporting firearms to hunting locations

Firearms must be:

1

Unloaded

3

In locked case, or

2

Always out of sight

4

Vital part removed, or

5

Trigger or cable lock fitted

6

Ammunition separate and secure

7

You can take a break of up to 60 mins, leaving your firearm in your locked vehicle, while remaining in the vicinity. Scan the QR code to read the extra conditions required when travelling with firearms.

A safer process for checking your firing zone

1

BACKGROUND



Identify and observe the area behind your target and ensure it is free of people/vehicles/buildings/stock and that it's suitable for the range and trajectory of the firearm you are using.

2

IDENTIFY THE TARGET



Identify your target beyond all doubt and ensure the immediate area around it is clear.

3

SIGHTS



Place the sights on the target.

Safety tip: Always unload and secure your firearm when you have finished using it.
