

Pistol Target Shooting ***Endorsement*** ***Application Form***

This application form is for all applicants for a pistol target shooting endorsement to a New Zealand firearms licence.

This application form is for those who are:

1. An existing firearms licence holder who wishes to use pistols; OR
2. Applying for a New Zealand Firearms Licence for the first time AND a pistol target shooting endorsement at the same time;
OR
3. Reapplying for their New Zealand Firearms Licence and wish to also:
 - › reapply for their existing pistol target shooting endorsement; OR
 - › apply for a pistol target shooting endorsement for the first time.

Important note:

1. Where you are a current licence holder and are applying for this endorsement for the first time, your application must contain both:
 - › This endorsement application form; AND
 - › A firearms licence application (FRM23FLA) with only sections A, F, G, H, L and N completed.
2. In all other cases, your application must contain both:
 - › This endorsement application form; AND
 - › A firearms licence application form completed in full to ensure Police has the latest information about you and your circumstances.

When applying for two or more endorsements at the same time only submit one application for a firearms licence.

Who can apply

To apply for a firearms licence endorsement you need to meet the following criteria:

- › You are sixteen years of age if applying for an endorsement to possess pistols, AND
- › You must hold a current ***New Zealand Firearms Licence***, or be applying for a Firearms Licence.

What you need to do

1. Complete the endorsement application form

Download the endorsement application form to your computer or device. Enter the information requested and save the form.

Important note: Please save the form to your device and open it using your PDF software. We recommend using **Adobe Acrobat Reader**. If the form is completed using a browser, the entered information may be lost if you click on the 'back' button or if you try to save it.

Print out and sign the completed endorsement application form, or print out a blank form and handwrite your responses.

2. Complete the firearms licence application form as appropriate

Download the firearms licence application form to your computer or device.

- » Where you are a current licence holder and are applying for this endorsement for the first time, complete only sections A, F, G, H, L and N.

In all other cases you must complete the firearms licence application in full.

Important note: Please save the form to your device and open it using your PDF software. We recommend using **Adobe Acrobat Reader**. If the form is completed using a browser, the entered information may be lost if you click on the 'back' button or if you try to save it.

Print out and sign the completed firearms licence application form, or print out a blank form and handwrite your responses.

3. Pay the fee

Pay the non-refundable endorsement application fee at a New Zealand PostShop and keep a receipt to include with your application.

NOTE: If you already have a current firearms licence you don't need to pay another firearms licence application fee.

4. Get the required documents

To submit a printed application form at a Police station you'll need to include:

- » a copy of the PostShop receipt of your application fee
- » the completed endorsement application form
- » a completed firearms licence application form

5. Inform the pistol club

Inform the pistol club that you are an active member of that you are applying for a pistol target shooting endorsement. The club will need to download and fill out a separate form.

6. Submit your application to Police

Submit your printed application at your nearest **Police station** or post it to Kapiti Digital Services Centre, PO Box 722, Paraparaumu 5032.

What you will need to apply

For your application to be considered, you will need to:

- » meet the endorsement eligibility criteria, and
- » have endorsement specific firearms storage facilities

In your endorsement application, you will need to be able to:

- » supply the name and contact details for an endorsement related referee who will be interviewed by Police as to your suitability to possess and use pistols.

What happens next

Once your application has been received, Police will perform further checks in order to assess whether you are suitable to possess and use pistols.

Police will ask your referee to fill out a questionnaire and then interview them.

You will need to:

- » attend an in person interview with Police to discuss your application and determine that you are suitable to possess and use pistols
- » show your endorsement specific firearms storage facilities

NOTE: Applying for or renewing a firearms licence or an endorsement is an activating circumstance. If this is your first activating circumstance, you are required to register all firearms in your personal possession **within 30 days**. You can do this online in MyFirearms or by calling the Registry and Services Team on 0800 844 431.

Note to Applicants

Endorsement application forms include questions which you may have been asked and answered in previous licence and / or endorsement applications. The purpose of asking these questions again is to ensure that we have the most current information available on which to review your application; and to ensure our record for you is correct and up to date.
