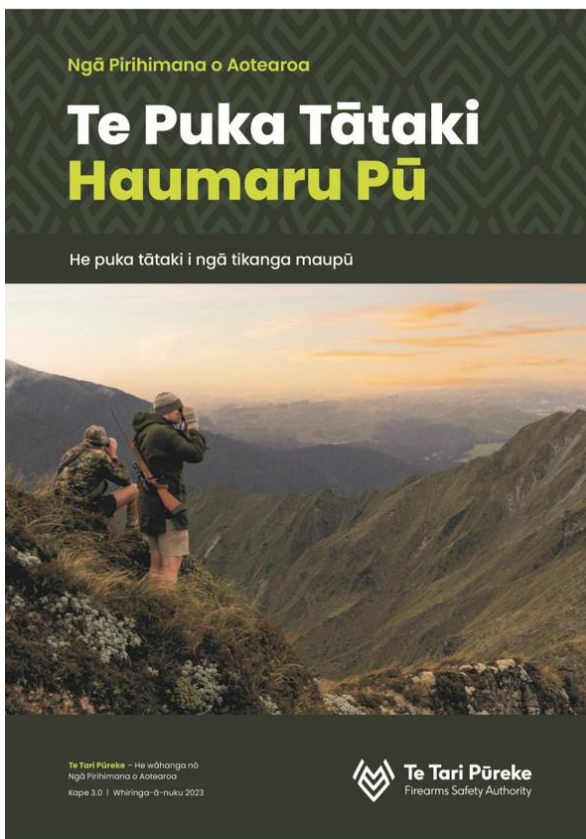

Earlier this month a Te Tari Pūreke team from Bay of Plenty attended the Rotorua Fishing, Hunting and 4x4 Show.

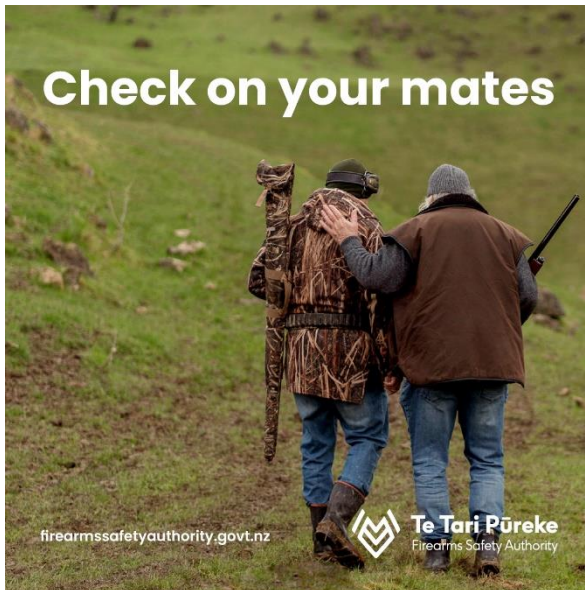

Check on your mates

Did you know that one in five New Zealanders will experience mental illness this year?

Mental health conditions are common, and may have symptoms that lead to safety concerns.

If you're concerned that the health of a firearms licence holder is adversely affecting their ability to possess firearms safely, there are a few things you can do.

- Encourage them to seek help from their GP, health provider or mental health support service.
- Arrange somewhere else to store their firearms. A firearms licence holder can store someone else's standard firearms for 30 days without needing to transfer possession in the registry.

We encourage anyone with symptoms to reach out and seek medical help and early treatment to help keep themselves and their family safe.

Te Tari Pūreke Regulatory Strategy

Te Tari Pūreke's Regulatory Strategy details our approach to effectively regulating the legitimate possession and use of firearms in New Zealand to keep our communities safe. It outlines the strategic shifts we are focused on achieving as we seek to become a world-class leader in firearms regulatory services.

Working with the Returned Services Association

Te Tari Pūreke Partnerships Directorate is collaborating closely with the Returned Services Association (RSA) and the Commemoration Committee to develop a chapter in the guide for [secure storage and transportation for firearms and ammunition](#).

This section will look at safe and compliant display of firearms for local RSA and artillery pieces in private collections. We are currently refining the guidance document, leveraging expertise from various stakeholders to create guidance that is both practical and respectful of commemorative events and displays at local RSA.
