

Application for Permit to Import Non-Prohibited Ammunition

A permit is not required to import ammunition components such as projectiles, empty cartridges, primers, BBs, or airgun pellets. **Section 18 of the Arms Act 1983** relates to the issuing of permits to import ammunition. Applicants should make their own enquiries about the requirements of other agencies.

Note for importer: If this application is approved, the permit will expire 12 months after the date it was issued. You must ensure that items arriving in New Zealand are accurately declared and/or labelled. If you fail to do so, NZ Customs can detain or seize items without compensation. You must notify Te Tari Pūreke – Firearms Safety Authority within 30 days after the date the item is imported into New Zealand. This date is when your item has been released by NZ Customs (Regulation 13). Notifications of import can be completed by emailing: importpermits@police.govt.nz. See the website for what details you must provide, and the dealer notification template. If you are importing as a firearms licence holder – you must also update your records in the Firearms Registry.
