

Memento/Heirloom

Application Form

This application form is for all applicants for a memento/heirloom endorsement to a New Zealand firearms licence.

This application form is for those who are:

- 1. About to come into the possession of pistols, restricted weapons, prohibited firearms and/or prohibited magazines that have special significance to them as memento or heirloom and:
 - have a current firearms licence; OR
 - are also applying for a New Zealand Firearms Licence for the first time; OR
- 2. Reapplying for their New Zealand Firearms Licence and:
 - wish to reapply for their existing memento/heirloom endorsement; OR
 - are about to come into the possession of pistols, restricted weapons, prohibited firearms and/or prohibited magazines and also wish to apply for a memento/heirloom endorsement for the first time.

Important note:

- Where you are a current licence holder and are applying for this endorsement for the first time, your application must contain both:
 - » This endorsement application form; AND
 - » A firearms licence application (FRM23FLA) with only sections A, F, G, H, L and N completed.
- 2. In all other cases, your application must contain both:
 - » This endorsement application form; AND
 - » A firearms licence application form completed in full to ensure Police has the latest information about you and your circumstances.

When applying for two or more endorsements at the same time only submit one application for a firearms licence.

Note on prohibited firearms and magazines: if you are about to come into the possession of firearms and/or magazines you may want to read the following sections of the Arms Act 1983 to ensure you are aware of the type of firearms, magazines and/or parts you are about to come into possession of:

- » s2A Meaning of prohibited firearm; AND
- » s2B Meaning of prohibited magazine; AND
- » s2C Meaning of prohibited part

Alternatively you can also discuss the specific firearms, magazines and/or parts with your local Arms Office. Find your local Arms Office *here*.

Who can apply

To apply for a firearms licence endorsement you need to meet the following criteria:

- » You are sixteen years of age if applying for an endorsement to possess pistols and restricted weapons; OR
- » You are at least eighteen years of age or older if applying for an endorsement to possess prohibited firearms and/or prohibited magazines; and
- » You must hold a current New Zealand Firearms Licence, or be applying for a Firearms Licence.

NOTE: You do not need to complete this heirloom/memento endorsement form if the firearms you are coming into possession of only consist of standard hunting and target shooting rifles and shotguns.

What you need to do

If you are completing other licence or endorsement applications at MyFirearms, you can attach this completed PDF form and pay for it online at the same time. Please ensure you read the following carefully before you begin your application for a firearms licence. An incomplete form will cause delays in processing your application.

1. Complete the endorsement application form

Download the endorsement application form to your computer or device. Enter the information requested and save the form.

Important note: Please save the form to your device and open it using your PDF software. We recommend using <u>Adobe</u>
<u>Acrobat Reader</u>. If the form is completed using a browser, the entered information may be lost if you click on the 'back' button or if you try to save it.

Print out and sign the completed endorsement application form, or print out a blank form and handwrite your responses.

2. Complete the firearms licence application form as appropriate

Download the firearms licence application form to your computer or device.

Where you are a current licence holder and are applying for this endorsement for the first time, complete only sections A, F, G, H, L and N.

In all other cases you must complete the firearms licence application in full.

3. Important note: Please save the form to your device and open it using your PDF software. We recommend using <u>Adobe</u>

<u>Acrobat Reader</u>. If the form is completed using a browser, the entered information may be lost if you click on the 'back' button or if you try to save it.

Print out and sign the completed firearms licence application form, or print out a blank form and handwrite your responses.

4. Pay the fee

Pay the non-refundable endorsement application fee at a New Zealand PostShop and keep a receipt to include with your application.

NOTE: If you already have a current firearms licence you don't need to pay another firearms licence application fee

5. Get the required documents

To submit a printed application form at a *Police station* you'll need to include:

- » a copy of the PostShop receipt of your application fee
- » the completed endorsement application form
- » a completed firearms licence application form

6. Submit your applications to Police

Submit your printed application to Police at your local Police station or by courier post to National Support Team, Te Tari Pūreke, Level 3, 210 Federal Street, Auckland 1010, New Zealand.

What you will need to apply

For your application to be considered, you will need to:

- » meet the endorsement eligibility criteria, and
- » have endorsement specific firearms storage facilities, and
- » a vital part storage location if you are intending to possess prohibited firearms.

What happens next

Once your application has been received, Police will perform further checks in order to assess whether you are fit and proper to possess pistols, restricted weapons, prohibited firearms and/or prohibited magazines (as relevant).

You will need to:

- » attend an in person interview with Police to discuss your application and determine that you are suitable to possess pistols, restricted weapons, prohibited firearms and/or prohibited magazines (as relevant), and
- » show your endorsement specific firearms storage facilities, and
- » show your vital part storage location if you are intending to possess prohibited firearms

NOTE: Applying for or renewing a firearms licence or an endorsement is an activating circumstance. If this is your first activating circumstance, you are required to register all firearms in your personal possession within 30 days. You can do this online in MyFirearms or by calling the Registry and Services team on 0800 844 431. Find out more about the Registry at **firearmssafetyauthority.govt.nz/registry**.
